
Region Västerbotten allocates development and growth funds also known as "1:1 anslag" to various development projects that contribute to regional development in Västerbotten.






# What are the requirements that are good to know?

For your project to be eligible for co-funding from Region Västerbotten, it must:

- 1. Contribute to RUS
- 2. Have a clear project logic
- 3. Be separated from regular activities
- 4. Must integrate sustainability aspects





# What other requirements and conditions do I need to know?

In addition, the following applies:

- Project support is provided for a maximum of 50% of the project's budget. Own financing shows applicants' interest and zeal to carry out the project. Financing from other actors such as other regions and kommuns are also important.
- The funding must not constitute state aid



#### **Autumn Calls 2025:**

- August 1 September 16: Applies to projects seeking co-financing from ERUF (ERDF), ESF + or seeking over 1.2 million in regional co-financing (from Region Västerbotten).
- September 8 October 6: Applies to projects seeking co-financing from Interreg Aurora or NPA.

The application must always be submitted before the project starting date!

### When can I apply?

#### Time-limited calls

- Opens 2 times a year, synced to the EU programmes.
- If you also apply for **co-funding from one of the** EU programmes, the application **must** be submitted to Region Västerbotten **no later than the same day** as the application deadline for the EU program in question. Late applications will not be handled.
- If you plan to apply for **only regional co-financing over SEK 1 200 000,** you must also submit your application within these calls.

### Minor project call

- It is always open to regional applications that do not apply for co-funding from any EU program.
- If you plan to submit a **regional application up to and including SEK 1 200 000**, you can submit your application within this call.



### Regarding RV's co-financing for Aurora applications

- Applications are done via Min Ansökan (same as Interreg Aurora)
- Applications can be made in English, but at least the summary should be in Swedish.
- Only the Swedish part of the budget, stated in SEK (not EUR)
- The budget must correspond to the application submitted to the Aurora program.
- The submission deadline is same as the Aurora program.
- Contact us before submitting the application.







- Many high quality products come from the region, such as:

  - Metalworking, machines and parts





# Region of Green Transition

- 2023 South Ostrobothnia
   produced 1697 GWh of wind electricity
   12 % of the total wind energy in Finland
  - With Ostrobothnia = 28%
- More is coming rapidly, and in the next phase also solar energy
- Today we are green electricity exporters
- Our industry is turning to green and also new green industry is emerging




### **Enabling transition**

- Underlying Long Term Drivers in Ostrobothnia:
  - Entrepreneurial Economy & Manufacturing Traditions
  - A Good Level of Education & High Labour Participation Rate
  - High Intensity of Business Driven Research, Development and Innovation -> R&D and innovation are driving forces of regional development
  - Frontrunners in several areas
- **Self reported investments** in the Confederation of Finlands Industry EK:s Data Dashboard
  - 25,6 billion € in Ostrobothnia alone
  - Wide portfolio: Wind, onshore, offshore; battery industry; energy storage; green hydrogen; e-fuels, carbon capture; transmission grids etc
    - Ostrobotnia has 3 % of Finland's population and 4 % of GDP, but approx. 8 % of FDI in green investments














# Finnish national co-funding - granted











# Finnish national co-funding

- Regional Council of Lapland makes the co-funding decisions and administers the payment applications of three Interreg programme; Interreg Aurora, Interreg Europe and Interreg Northern Periphery and Arctic
- Financing is granted within the limits of annual financing allocation from the national authority, Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment of Finland.
- National co-funding can be up to 70% of the non-EU portion of the budget, min 4 900 € and max 200 000 € per project.
- Beneficiary can apply pre-financing, max 30 % of the grant. The need for the pre-financing shall be justified.









# How and when to apply



- Application submission to the Regional Council of Lapland within 4 months of the official decision of the EU-funding decision is an annex of the application
  - Only in very limited cases a late application can be accepted.
- If the project has several Finnish partners, one (Finnish lead partner) of them shall apply the financing on behalf of all Finnish project partners one application submitted
- Finnish lead partner receives the decision and manages the communication with the financier (reporting, payments etc.)







# Partnership contract




- If the project has several Finnish partners, they shall prepare the partnership contract, including agreement of
  - ➤ the Finnish Lead partner who will apply the financing and request the payments
  - > the use of financing only for the purposes specified in the decision
  - >mutual rights and obligations
  - >mutual procedures regarding financial transactions

# **Control (FLC) functions in Aurora**



- Finland has a centralised model, Aurora control tasks are located in the Regional Council of Lapland
- No costs to the project partners
- The check is carried out in Min Ansökan –system

National co-financing payment is requested within 3 months of the EU-payment decision.









# Three "take-aways":




- 1. Apply national co-financing only after you receive the EU-decision (Notification of decision EU-support) from the EU programme.
- 2. If the project has several Finnish partners, one of them submits the co-financing application on behalf of others. Cooperation agreement is needed as an annex.
- 3. No need to reserve funding for the "FLC" costs in the budget!
